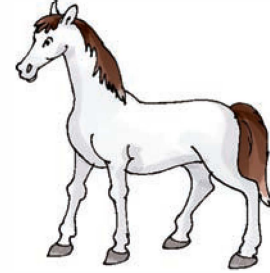


## Chapter 9. Adjectives
